But I Can't Use a Computer! - Help for those seeking work

The computer and the internet have become an important tool for those looking for work, but many of us do not have a computer or the knowledge to use this tool. Through a United Way Grant the library can help.

Recognizing that many people do not have the basic skills needed to use a computer, the library has developed very basic, one hour classes to help you learn the skills necessary to get started with a computer. The first class, "Learn to Use a Computer Keyboard and Mouse", has already been presented twice with good reviews. Classes on "Introduction to the Internet" and "Get and Use a Free E-Mail Account" are also ready for patrons. There are more classes being developed. Sign-up sheets for these classes are available at each library building in the county. Let people who could use this service know that they should stop into their local library to sign-up.
