Book Review Corner

Books by David Wiesner



David Wiesner is a very talented children's book author and illustrator. His most recent, *Flotsam*, earned him his second Caldecott Medal (awarded to the most distinguished American picture book for children), and it's well-deserved. The book has no words, but the illustrations tell the story perfectly. A young boy, spending the day at the beach with his family, finds a camera that has traveled across the ocean and even through time. The photographs tell stories of underwater lives and other children of the past who've found the camera.

Strange things happen on Tuesdays, at least in Wiesner's world. The great illustrations in his book, *Tuesday*, show frogs whose lily pads suddenly levitate and take them flying through town on a night-time adventure. When the sun rises, the spell is broken, but you never know what will happen next Tuesday...

Hurricane tells the story of two brothers who emerge after a storm in their neighborhood to find a jungle, a sailing ship, and more in a fallen tree in the neighbor's yard. It has more words than the other two books, but they only enhance the drawings, which could tell the story on their own. Check out these books and others by David Wiesner.
